Forbid it, Lord, that I should boast, Save in the death of Christ my God! All the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to His blood.


See from His head, His hands, His feet, Sorrow and love flow mingled down! Did e'er such love and sorrow meet. Or thorns compose so rich a crown?

Carmelite Rite Propers of the Mass Eighth Sunday after Trinity

(for 10am Mass only)

Introit: We have received thy mercy, O God, in the midst of thy temple. According to thy name, O God, so also is thy praise unto the ends of the earth: thy right hand is full of justice. Great is the Lord, and exceedingly to be praised in the city of our God, in his holy mountain. Glory be...

Collect: O God, by whose never-failing providence the world is ordered, we humbly entreat thee to remove from our path all hurtful things and to give us all that will be for our good: through our Lord...

Epistle: Lesson from the Epistle of S. Paul to the Romans: Therefore, brethren, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live according to the flesh. For if you live according to the flesh, you shall die: but if by the Spirit you mortify the deeds of the flesh, you shall live. For whosoever are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God. For you have not received the spirit of bondage again in fear; but you have received the spirit of adoption of sons, whereby we cry: Abba (Father). For the Spirit himself giveth testimony to our spirit, that we are the sons of God. And if sons, heirs also; heirs indeed of God, and joint heirs with Christ.

Gradual: How long shall I take counsels in my soul, sorrow in my heart all the day? How long shall my enemy be exalted over me? Alleluia, alleluia. Deliver me from my enemies, O my God; and defend me from them that rise up against me. Alleluia

Gospel: Continuation of the Holy Gospel according to St. Matthew: Beware of false prophets, who come to you in the clothing of sheep, but inwardly they are ravening wolves. By their fruits you shall know them. Do men gather grapes of thorns, or figs of thistles? Even so every good tree bringeth forth good fruit, and the evil tree bringeth forth evil fruit. A good tree cannot bring forth evil fruit, neither can an evil tree bring forth good fruit. Every tree that bringeth not forth good fruit, shall be cut down, and shall be cast into the fire. Wherefore by their fruits you shall know them. Not every one that saith to me, Lord, Lord, shall enter into the kingdom of heaven: but he that doth the will of my Father who is in heaven, he shall enter into the kingdom of heaven.

Secret: God, who by a single perfect sacrifice hast ratified the variety of offerings made under the old law, accept these sacrificial gifts from thy devout servants, and hallow them with the same blessing as thou didst bestow on Abel's, so that the gift offered by each one of us in honour of thy majesty may further the salvation of us all: through our Lord...
