PROPERS OF THE MASS

Epistle Phil 2:5-11

Brethren: Have this in mind in you which was also in Christ Jesus, Who, though He was by nature God, did not consider being equal to God a thing to be clung to, but emptied Himself, taking the nature of a slave and being made like unto men. And appearing in the form of man, He humbled Himself, becoming obedient to death, even to death on a cross. Therefore God also has exalted Him and has bestowed upon Him the Name that is above every name, (Kneel) so that at the Name of Jesus every knee should bend of those in heaven, on earth and under the earth and every tongue should confess that the Lord Jesus Christ is in the glory of God

the Father.

Gospel Matt 21:1-9

At Low Mass, the following Gospel replaces the Last Gospel. At Solemn High Mass, it is read before Mass begins, after the Blessing of Palms.

At that time, when Jesus drew nigh to Jerusalem, and was come to Bethphage, unto Mount Olivet, then He sent two disciples, saying to them: Go ye into the village that is over against you, and immediately you shall find an ass tied, and a colt with her: loose them and bring them to Me. And if any man shall say anything to you, say ye, that the Lord hath need of them: and forthwith he will let them go. Now all this was

done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying: Tell ye the daughter of Sion: Behold thy King cometh to thee, meek, and sitting upon an ass, and a colt the foal of her that is used to the yoke. And the disciples going, did as Jesus commanded them. And they brought the ass and the colt, and laid their garments upon them, and made him sit thereon. And a very great multitude spread their garments in the way: and others cut boughs from the trees, and strewed them in the way, and the multitudes that went before and that followed, cried, saying: Hosanna to the Son of David: Blessed is He that cometh in the name of the Lord.

Spiritual Communion

In light of the recent decision to suspend public Masses in the effort to help stem the spread of the coronavirus, we wanted to provide you all with an instruction on how to make a "Spiritual Communion," by which we invite Our Lord to come into our souls in a particular way to give us the graces we need. The Church grants a partial indulgence to us for making spiritual communions.

There is no one "right way" of making a Spiritual Communion, but here is one method we can practice:

- 1. Find a quiet space and time and put yourself in the presence of God. (If you are able to do some meditation or spiritual reading, it is often good to conclude your meditation with this spiritual reading.)
- 2. Invite Our Lord to come into your soul and give you the graces He would have given you had you received Him sacramentally that day.
- 3. Tell Him of your great desire to receive Him sacramentally, and pray that conditions may be such that we may allow the reopening of churches. Thank Him for the graces He is giving you, and ask pardon for your own sins and infidelities.
- 4. Spend a moment quietly adoring His presence within you.

Alternatively, you can also just say the following prayer:

My Jesus, I believe that You are present in the Most Holy Sacrament. I love You above all things, and I desire to receive You into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive You sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. I embrace You as if You were already there and unite myself wholly to You. Never permit me to be separated from You. Amen.
