number and intensity. If we get lazy, no one will stop us from giving them up. During Lent, our penances can cause pain and discomfort, but we retain control. In the current situation, the cause of our sufferings is outside of our control; we haven't chosen this penance and we can't give it up when it feels too difficult.

It is impossible for us to understand in all of its depth and breadth why our Heavenly Father is permitting our current suffering. But on an individual level, of course we know that He is trying to purify us. And unlike during Lent when we choose our own penances, right now He is choosing them for us. We have to forfeit control. Let's continue to do our best to surrender our wills to our Heavenly Father's.

We all know that the COVID-19 situation has caused a lot of suffering and deprivation in many areas of people's lives. On a sacramental level, we've now missed six Sunday Masses, over fifty public daily Masses, hundreds of Confessions, thousands of Holy Communions and countless hours of adoration. This separation from the sacraments is certainly painful.

We still have no information about the lifting of restrictions on public worship and the use of our churches. The most recent news from the diocese is that we will be notified when these decisions are made. Aside from that, we have not been given any indication of potential scenarios.

Since the suffering caused by this current situation is outside of our control, perhaps we can contrast it with the sufferings of Lent. During Lent we choose our penances, their
