## Gospel Matt 22:34-46

At that time, the Pharisees came to Jesus and one of them, a doctor of the Law, putting Him to the test, asked Him, Master, which is the great commandment in the Law? Jesus said to him, 'You shall love the Lord your God with your whole heart, and with your whole soul, and with your whole mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And the second is like it, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' On these two commandments de-

pend the whole Law and the Prophets. Now while the Pharisees were gathered together, Jesus questioned them, saying, What do you think of the Christ? Whose son is He? They said to Him, David's. He said to them, How then does David in the spirit call Him Lord, saying, The Lord said to my Lord: Sit at My right hand, till I make Your enemies Your footstool?' If David, therefore, calls Him 'Lord,' how is He his son? And no one could answer Him a word; neither did anyone dare from that day forth to ask Him any more questions.

#### The Significance of Vestments

"There is not one word said in mass, nor even the least action or ceremony, but indicates something holy and mysterious; nay, even the ornaments which the priests wears at the altar have also a mysterious signification.

The Amice, which is a piece of linen cloth that he puts about his neck, and which covers his shoulders, represents the veil with which the soldiers covered the face of the Son of God, when, striking him, they said to him, 'prophesy who it is that struck thee' (Luke xxii. 6.) The Alb signifies the white robe which Herod, in mockery, caused to be put upon him, when he sent him back to Pilate. The Cincture represents the cords with which he was bound when he was apprehended in the garden, and the whips with which he was torn by command of Pilate. The Maniple signifies the cords with which he was bound to the pillar in the judgement-hall, this he puts upon the left arm, which is next the heart, to signify that is was the excess of his love that made Christ suffer this cruel flagellation for our sins, and that we ought to correspond to this love by all the tenderness our heart is capable of. The Stole represents the cord, which they cast about his neck when he carried the cross. The Chasuble, or Vestment, according to some, was the purple robe which they put upon him to scoff him, or, according to others, the tunic, or coat without seam, which they stripped him of to crucify him. The entrance of the priest into the sacristy to put on the ornaments, represents the descent of the Son of God into the woman of the holy Virgin, where he clothed himself with out flesh and with out humanity, to go and celebrate the sacrifice upon the cross."

#### A reminder of the diocesan directives we are following:

- Except in the case of children under 2 years of age and persons with health issues, masks are to be worn as face covering the entire time parishioners attend Mass or any other liturgical event in a parish, including sacramental Confession. They are not permitted to be lowered at any time while in the church except to receive Holy Communion. Those unable to wear a mask are asked to sit toward the back of the church.
- Social distancing is to be observed. The measure of 6 feet between individuals and family groups is to be maintained while seated and moving. Groups are not to gather outside of the church for social time. Face masks should be worn until a person has left the church property and distanced himself or herself from the other congregants.
- Sanitization of public spaces takes place after every liturgical gathering in our churches.
