Epistle Apoc 7:2-12

Eucharistic Procession and Rosary Today

For those planning to attend the Eucharistic procession and recitation of the Holy Rosary today, the schedule is as follows:

- 1:15 p.m. Exposition of the Most Blessed Sacrament at the Conclusion of Holy Mass, followed by a period of silent prayer and adoration
- 1:30 p.m. Procession of the Most Blessed Sacrament up State Street and around the Capitol complex (the Litany of Saints and Litany of the Most Blessed Sacrament will be sung)
- Return to the Cathedral for the Recitation of the Holy Rosary
- The Blessed Sacrament will be placed upon the Altar of the Cathedral, incensed with the singing of Tantum Ergo, followed by Benediction of the Most Blessed Sacrament

All Souls Novena — Plenary Indulgence

November is dedicated to the Holy Souls. From November 1 to November 8, inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls in Purgatory, is granted to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed, provided the usual conditions are met. Partial indulgences are granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead, and to those who recite the Eternal Rest Prayer provided below. Only one plenary indulgence may be granted each day, but a partial indulgence may be granted more than once a day.

On All Souls Day, a plenary indulgence for Poor Souls will be granted to those who visit any parish church or public oratory and there recite one Our Father and one Credo. The usual conditions to acquire a plenary indulgence are sacramental confession, Holy Communion, prayer for the intention of the Holy Father, and detachment from sin, even venial sin. If these conditions are not met, the indulgence will be partial.

A reminder of the diocesan directives we are following:

- Except in the case of children under 2 years of age and persons with health issues, masks are to be worn as face covering the entire time parishioners attend Mass or any other liturgical event in a parish, including sacramental Confession. They are not permitted to be lowered at any time while in the church except to receive Holy Communion. Those unable to wear a mask are asked to sit toward the back of the church.
- Social distancing is to be observed. The measure of 6 feet between individuals and family groups is to be
 maintained while seated and moving. Groups are not to gather outside of the church for social time. Face
 masks should be worn until a person has left the church property and distanced himself or herself from
 the other congregants.
- Sanitization of public spaces takes place after every liturgical gathering in our churches.
