The St. Lawrence Altars

The Gothic altars carved in Italy using Cenere marble feature the likenesses of several saints.

On the main altar, from left to right, St. Lawrence, the martyred deacon; St. Anthony of Padua, Franciscan preacher and teacher; St. Agnes, the young martyr whose likeness also appears on the choir loft railing by the bell tower; St. John the Baptist, herald of Jesus Christ, St. Aloysius, Jesuit and patron of the young; St. Helena, said to be the discoverer of the Holy Cross; St. Clare, co-foundress of the Poor Clares; St. Stephen, the first martyr.

The left side altar bears the familiar likeness of the Blessed Virgin Mary, her hands folded in prayer. The shield above her head represents the Gate of Heaven. The Latin inscription proclaims: Hail, full of grace, the Lord is with you; Blessed are You among women.

The right side altar supports the equally familiar rendering of St. Joseph, lilies in hand, under a shield bearing the Latin legend: *Protector of the Holy Church*. The inscription behind the statue is a simple prayer: *Saint Joseph, foster father of the Son of God, pray for us.*
