

of the Immaculate Conception, Dec. 8, which is the patronal feast of the United States. Therefore, those wishing to participate should start their 33-day prepara-November 5. Though tion on this preparation will be done by individuals/families privately, we will recite this consecration publicly as a parish after the Masses we have on the Immaculate Conception.
