Matt 20:1-16

At that time, Jesus spoke to His disciples this parable: The kingdom of heaven is like a householder who went out early in the morning to hire laborers for his vineyard. And having agreed with the laborers for a denarius a day, he sent them into his vineyard. And about the third hour, he went out and saw others standing in the market place idle; and he said to them, 'Go you also into the vineyard, and I will give you whatever is just.' So they went. And again he went out about the sixth, and about the ninth hour, and did as before. But about the eleventh hour he went out and found others standing about and he said to them, 'Why do you stand here all day idle?' They said to him, 'Because no man has hired us.' He said to them, 'Go you also into the vineyard.' But when evening had come, the owner of the vineyard said to his steward,

'Call the laborers, and pay them their wages, beginning from the last even to the first.' Now when they of the eleventh hour came, they received each a denarius. And when the first in their term came, they thought that they would receive more; but they also received each his denarius. And on receiving it, they began to murmur against the householder, saying, 'These last have worked a single hour, and you have put them on a level with us, who have borne the burden of the day's heat.' But answering one of them, he said, 'Friend, I do you no injustice; did you not agree with me for a denarius? Take what is yours and go; I choose to give to this last even as to you. Have I not a right to do what I choose? Or are you envious because I am generous?' Even so the last shall be first, and the first last; for many are called, but few are chosen

NEW KNIGHTS OF COLUMBUS COUNCIL: Having had



a strong response from the men of the parish interested in establishing a new council of Knights, Fr. Smith has decided to move forward with inviting the Knights of Columbus to establish a council here at St. Lawrence. The next step will be a degree ceremony on Saturday, February 19 at 10:30am, at which all men intending to join

are welcome. This ceremony is meant to initiate the following men (18 and up) into the Knights of Columbus: those who are not members of the Knights of Columbus, current e-members, and for all 1st and 2nd degree members. At the same time, it is open to the public, and anyone may come and show their support.

How long is the ceremony? Approximately 30-40 minutes.

What are some special elements of the ceremony? The ceremony emphasizes Fidelity to the Church, chivalry, brotherhood, the centrality of the Eucharist, and the Marian devotion that is expected of all Knights.

What is the purpose of the Knights of Columbus? The Knights of Columbus see themselves as the "strong right arm of the Church" (Pope St. John Paul II). They strive to unite men in service to Christ and the Catholic Church, especially through works of charity, building up parish and family life, financial protection, and through their strong support of, and service to priests.

I thought Knights of Columbus ceremonies were private? In an attempt to better serve the needs of the Order, the Knights of Columbus now has a public ceremony which anyone, including wives and children, may attend.

What does a Knight promise in the initiation ceremony?

- 1) to conduct oneself as a Catholic gentleman, and to live a life guided by the principles of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity.
- 2) as a practical (practicing) Catholic, to continue to form oneself in the Catholic Faith, to live in accord with the Precepts of the Catholic Church, and to participate in its sacramental life, especially through attendance at Sunday Mass
- 3) to promote the well-being of ones brother Knights, and to support the mission and activities of your council.
- 4) to obey the laws, rules and lawful authority of the Order.
